**CONSERVATION/GREENVILLE CREST**

Thursday, 19 December the City Plan Commission voted to authorize a

**CONSTRUCTION SITE MANAGEMENT**

Is there new construction going on next door to you? Perhaps you have gone for a walk and observed litter at a construction site. The city building inspection department has been educating building contractors for some time. Site requirements include an information sign readable from the street; it must contain the general contractor's name, telephone number and address of the project and where violations can be reported. Silt fences are required for all new construction areas. Damage to public infrastructure (street, inlet,etc.) must be quickly

repaired. Litter and waste must be contained. Rights-of-way may not be used for staging unless a barricade permit is approved by the department of public works and transportation. Further information may be obtained by calling 214-948-4480.
